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DIRECTOR'S REPORT

With its foundation laid in 1996, the Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode (IIMK) has accomplished twenty years of academic distinction this year. It emerged as an internationally reckoned fully-integrated management Institute of higher learning. Unstinted guidance, support and cooperation from the Chairman and esteemed members of the IIMK Society, Board of Governors, Faculty and Staff members and the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India and the Government of Kerala has made this possible.

The Institute continues to outshine itself with each passing year. The year 2015–2016 was momentous and surpassed every expectation in terms of quality and quantity of achievements. With an exceptional blend of academia, consultancy and research, we could draw upon reserves of goodwill among the Diasporas of our alumni, repute among recruiters and

prospective students, and a team of committed faculties. It is with pride that I present a note of our achievements during this year.

During the year, 18th Batch (2014–2016) of the Post Graduate Programme students graduated. The 18th Convocation of the Institute was held on April 2, 2016 wherein 347 students received their diplomas. Three students of Fellow Programme in Management (FPM) were conferred the title of Fellow of IIM Kozhikode. 167 students of the 6th Batch of Executive Post Graduate Programme received their diplomas during the Convocation. Also the first batch of 97 students from Executive Post Graduate Programme of IIMK Kochi campus received their diplomas during the Convocation. Shri Vinod Rai, first Chairman of the Banks Board Bureau and former Comptroller & Auditor General of India and former Chairman of United Nations Panel of External Auditors delivered the Convocation Address.

The final placement of the 18th Batch students this year was completed in a record time of 7 days. New companies like 3M, Bank of America, Boston Consulting Group, Brand Accelerator, Capita, Caratlane, Credit Suisse, Ernst & Young, Frost and Sullivan, Mondelez, Paytm, Schneider, Shell participated. Out of the 119 recruiters visited, the institute saw 370 offers being rolled out to the students.

As a centre of excellence and centre of experience, Management Development Programmes continued to be an important activity of the Institute. During the year, a total of 85 MDPs were conducted and 2376 participants benefited from them. Faculty Development Programmes continued to be yet another important area of activity of IIMK. During the year, as many as 13 FDPs were organized and 215 participants benefited from the FDPs. In the IIMK Kochi Campus, 7 MDPs were conducted during the year and 160 participants benefited therefrom.

Fellow Programme in Management (FPM) of IIMK continued to attract good talent from across the nation. This year 7 students registered for the programme.

The Association of MBAs have reaccredited all our long duration programs for another five years. This reaffirms our commitment to academic excellence. National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF), in its first India Rankings 2016, ranked IIMK Number 6 amongst the management institutions.

Faculty contribution towards Research, Publication & Conference during the year include authoring of 45 Research Articles (out of this, six A* and five A category journals), 26 working papers and cases, publishing of 4 books, 7 book chapters, making 90 conference presentations and completing

2 Small Grant Research Projects and one Medium Grant Research Project. The Institute organized the 52nd Annual Conference of The Indian Econometric Society during the year.

IIMK's International Exchange Programme endeavors to work with partner institutions to develop activities that foster trusting, enduring and mutually beneficial scholarly and social engagements between students, faculty members, staff and the broader community in countries across the globe. As part of international faculty and student exchange program of the Institute, one new collaborative agreement was signed during the year with MAYS Business School-Texas, USA; making the total number of partner institutions 36. A total of 82 IIMK students spent a term at 23 partner institutions and as many as 34 international students from 10 partner institutions spent a term at IIMK as part of student exchange programme.

The Institute continued with its commitment to provide state-of-the-art IT facilities to the IIMK user community and strived to seize opportunities to create innovations. To achieve the above objective and also to improve pedagogy at IIMK, the computing facilities and services have continuously and significantly been improved over the year. Likewise, the library facility also continued to grow during the year to cater to the growing academic population.

With its highly qualified and experienced faculty, backed by a large number of committed adjunct and visiting faculties from Industry and other leading management institutes including foreign universities, IIMK has always attracted the best brains from across the globe. During the year we had 56 permanent faculties and 5 visiting faculties.

In order to augment the infrastructure facilities of the campus, Phase V campus development activities started in the newly acquired land. The facilities planned for the 1st Stage of Phase V infrastructure primarily comprise 400–bed capacity hostel complex with dining and kitchen facilities; classrooms and offices; 50 housing units/apartments, development of eco-friendly rainwater harvesting pond for augmenting the water supply together with augmentation of power supply.

Persistent coordination from all stakeholders, taking the Institute to its valued pinnacle is what I look forward to.

The two year Post Graduate Programme (PGP) in Management of the Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode (IIMK) offers a judicious blend of theory and practice, and is deliberately designed to be change oriented. The course curriculum is continually reviewed and updated to cater to the requirements of the industry and reflect changes in the environment. A unique feature of the PGP is its in-built concern for the larger society as reflected in the design of the curriculum, which aims at nurturing ethically conscious and socially responsible leaders of the future. The Programme is accredited by the Association of MBAs (AMBA).

Consistent with the Institute's goal of creating business leaders who are socially, ethically and environmentally responsible, each student is required to provide active planning and execution to help non-profit organizations. The Social Development Project is a non-credit compulsory component of the IIMK PGP. The SDP is spread over two years, making it possible for them to carry out the projectrelated work at their convenience.

The PGP concentrates on subjects in diverse functional areas during first year, equipping the student with basic skills and knowledge needed at the managerial level in any organization. During the second year, students can select subjects in their area of interest. Elective Courses are offered in Finance, Organizational Beheviour and Human Resources, Accounting & Control, Marketing, Information Technology & Systems, Quantitative Methods & Operations Management, Economics, Strategy, and Humanities & Liberal Arts. The programme lays great emphasis on knowledge assimilation and towards this end, it uses a wide variety of pedagogies like lectures, case studies, exercises, roleplays, simulation, video shows etc. ensuring a holistic perspective on the economic, technical, cultural and global impact of business.


The classes for Term IV of PGP 18 batch commenced on June 11, 2015. A total of 360 students registered for Term IV (including 2 Repeaters from PGP 17 and 11 DPP participants). Five students of PGP 18 had opted for Differentially Paced Programme. One student was terminated from the programme owing to academic shortfall and will be repeating with PGP 19 Batch.

New Batch

The Induction ceremony of the PGP 19 was held on July 01, 2015. The Orientation Programme for PGP 19 was held during June 24-30, 2015. During the orientation, different pedagogy and teaching methods were introduced to the students, workshops on Business History was also conducted. Mr. Sandeep Chatterjee & Mr. Ranjeet Pawar IIMK Alumni had interacted with the new batch and handled sessions.

A total of 363 students finally registered for the Post Graduate Programme. Of the 363 students, the numbers of female students are 97. Five students of Batch 18 who had opted for the Differentially Paced Post Graduate Programme (DPP) joined the programme with PGP 19. Twenty students had left the programme owing to personal / academic reasons. Thus, the total strength of PGP 19 batch is 348, and the details are as follows:

Structure of the Programme: A practical mix of different teaching methods, evolved using feedbacks from students and other programme participants, is employed at the Institute. The importance is on learning processes and learning outcomes for the augmentation of managerial abilities. The problem solving and analytical skills are honed through case studies, which are part of pedagogy in most of the courses. The Post Graduate Programme also provides direct student links with industry and enhancement of application skills through projects undertaken for industry by students.

The first year of the programme is devoted to building up basic competence in core areas and in developing a holistic and socially mindful attitude to management. Courses in the first year are compulsory for all students. The aim of the compulsory package is to provide participants with the fundamental knowledge, skills and techniques, contextual understanding, and overall perspective, necessary for general management. Considering the importance of the compulsory, foundation-building courses offered in the first year, a substantial portion of the teaching load was taken on by the permanent faculty of the Institute. The Summer Internship and the Social Development Project provide the testing grounds for this intense learning experience.

The second year, as usual, provided the opportunity to reach greater depths of skills and capability

in chosen areas. Apart from the compulsory courses of International Business, the Institute offered the following optional courses in the second year of the PGP:

Business Research Methods: Prof. C. Raju and Prof. Atanu Adhikari conducted BRM Workshop during Term II for PGP 19 batch.







FELLOW PROGRAMME IN MANAGEMENT (FPM)


Introduction

The Fellow Programme in Management of IIM Kozhikode is a doctoral level programme that aims to produce a cadre of high quality management scholars and researchers. IIMs see the Fellow Programme as a crucial source of management researchers and faculty resources of top quality both to the academic institutions including IIMs and to the industry, business, government and society. FPM is designed for a normal period of four years. The programme requires candidates to undergo a rigorous two year course work in which the first year is largely common with the first year of the Post Graduate Programme in Management, while the second year is devoted to advanced doctoral level course in the candidate's area of specialization. The course comprehensively covers inputs on research methods and pedagogy in management teaching.

Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode launched its FPM programme during the academic year 2007-08 so as to deliver high quality candidates with sufficient training. The programme attracts talented students from all over the world, and we have created an environment that is ideal for people to experiment new ideas and persistently inspire them to develop innovative directions. Further, IIMK provide the students with the indelible tools so that they can be creative and inquisitive to seize the right opportunities and face the challenges and threats in this changing global scenario.

FPM at IIMK

Presently seven areas of specialization are being offered viz., Economics, Finance, Accounting and Control, IT and Systems, Marketing, OB and Human Resources, QM and Operations Management and Strategic Management. The FPM Programme is designed for a normal period of 4 years. An FPM student is required to take a total of 61 credits and 64.5 credits during the first and second years respectively. Currently there are 52 students in the FPM Programme at IIM Kozhikode in six areas.




Financial Support

The important feature of the programme is that it offers attractive financial support to candidates, in lieu of which, the Institute is very selective in offering admission to the programme. This ensures that the quality is checked at the input stage. Further, the students joining the programme are exempted from paying tuition fee.

All Indian students joining the FPM would be given a stipend of Rs. 27,000/- per month for the first and second years, Rs. 29,700/ per month on successful completion of Comprehensive examination and Rs.33,000/- per month after successful presentation and defense of Thesis proposal. During the last six months of the fifth year a stipend as decided by the student's Research Advisory Committee is given. A contingency grant of Rs. 1,20,000 can be used throughout the six years of the programme for meeting the expenses on books, stationery, computers, etc. Further, financial supports for attending National (Rs.20,000/-) and International Conferences (Rs.1,75,000/-) are also provided

FPM Admission 2015

A total of 120 students had applied for the programme through online, and the interview was held during March 25-27, 2015. IIMK offered admission for nine candidates into FPM Course for the FPM Nineth Batch (Academic Year 2015-16). Out of nine offers nine candidates had confirmed their participation. On the registration process only seven candidates had registered.



With 35% percent of the batch placed in companies like HUL, Nestle, ITC, Philips, Perfetti Van Melle, Marico, L'Oreal, Godrej, Shell, Kelloggs, Asian Paints, Vodafone, Pidilite, HCCB, Raymond, Idea amongst others, IIM Kozhikode maintained its highest intake in the Sales and Marketing domain.

IIMK has been seeing an upward trend in the number of consulting companies visiting the campus for recruitment, with over 16% percent of the batch securing offers from BCG, Accenture Strategy, Deloitte, EY, KPMG, Cognizant Business Consulting amongst others. TAS, Mahindra, Airtel, Reliance and RPG provided General Management roles to the students across varied sectors.



Lateral and Final Placements, 2016 - Batch of PGP 18

The 18th batch of the Post Graduate Programme of IIM Kozhikode concluded its final placements in a record seven days. The season witnessed an increase in the number of recruiters visiting campus for the first time and students being offered niche roles. With over 119 recruiters and 370 offers, this year's placements continued the trend of increasing average salary being offered to the students at INR 17.1 lakhs per annum, a growth of 12% from previous year. The highest domestic package was INR 37 lakhs per annum.






During the year 2015-16, IIM Kozhikode has entered into collaborative agreements with the Institute, MAYS Business School, Texas – USA.







Innovations in Library Services and Information Management

Over the years the LIC has registered significant progress and has brought worldwide recognition and laurels to IIMK. The E-Learning Platform developed by the Center for Development of Digital Libraries (CDDL) for the WHO India Office (http://www.rguhs.ac.in/E-learningModule/index.html), the Information Portal for the Coir Board (http://coirboard.nic.in), the Greenstone Support Network for South Asia (http://greenstonesupport.iimk. ac.in) are just a few to mention. IIMK's ambitious Digital Library project (http://iimk.ac.in/gsdl/cgi-bin/library), sponsored by the Ministry of HRD (Government of India), received the status of an example collection from the world renowned "Greenstone" family of the University of Waikato, New Zealand.

Another important landmark has been the commissioning of the Smart-Card based Access Control System and the Smart-Gate based E-Security System. The latest in the series of services is the "Leadership Compass" (http://leadership.iimk.ac.in) targeted towards the management fraternity. The LIC at IIMK is a digital delight, available 24 hours a day, and spans throughout the campus. It is a perfect blend of digital, audio, video and print media with cutting-edge technology. It is an outstanding knowledge-centre catering to the faculty, students and research scholars. It houses over 36323 books in print form, over 167 print journals, over 2,00,000 E-Books, 6119 Bound Volumes of research Journals, over 15000 corporate annual reports and more than 20000 E-Journals from India and abroad, in addition to as many as 3700 CD-ROM publications on contemporary issues.

The audio/visual unit in the LIC hosts over 274 educational videos covering a wide range of disciplines in management. The Video Digital Library streams out the educational videos throughout the entire campus. Around 65 full-text/bibliographic CD-ROM databases on scholarly information coupled with a set of national and international databases on companies, industries and the markets are available to users through a local area network (LAN). The gallery, a spectacular unit of the Museum, is truly a visual treat. It tells the magnificent space odyssey, the saga of Indian Space programme that has given tremendous contributions to the country over the past six

decades. A total of Rs. 50 Lakhs have been jointly invested by IIMK and ISRO, for the design and creation of this Gallery which spans over 850 Sg. Ft. area in the mezzanine floor.

The Business Museum is visited by lots of schools/students and colleges from across the country. Almost all guests of the Institute make it a point to visit the Museum during their stay on campus. The feedback received is quite excellent and encouraging.



CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT

The Institute is poised for further expansion of its campus infrastructure in the near future to meet the requirements commensurate with its planned academic growth. Accordingly, the environment-friendly yet state-of-the-art Phase V campus buildings & structures are being developed in a phased manner while envisaging world-class facilities that aim for ambitious GRIHA (i.e. Green Rating for Integrated Habitat Assessment) norms. Following the development of the first stage of the eco-friendly rain water harvesting Pond (forming part of the Phase V campus buildings & structures), which had been completed, the water supply requirements of the Institute's campus has been augmented. While the construction of compound wall for the Phase V campus premises has already been completed and the construction of the Phase V internal roads are nearing completion, the other priority Phase V campus buildings & structures including Hostels, Dining (with kitchen), etc. are in progress

The operationalization of the Management Development Centre (MDC), having state-of-the-art academic and residential facilities, has boosted our in-campus capacity to accommodate our participants, delegates and other guests of various management development programmes being organized by the Institute.

Value addition of existing infrastructural facilities, including maintenance and miscellaneous construction activities were also taken up on the side-lines of the major campus development activities in line with the increase in the Institute's academic activities.

In addition to providing excellent and state-of-the-art infrastructural facilities in picturesque settings, sustainable and eco-friendly water-resource management systems were implemented besides initiating other environment-friendly energy conservation measures including solar powered lighting, replacement of lighting fixtures with energy efficient ones, etc.

ANNUAL ACCOUNTS & FINANCIAL POSITIONS

The Annual Financial Statements for the year 2015-16 was approved and adopted by the BOG on 11th June 2016 and submitted to the principal Accountant General (Audit) Kerala for Audit Certification. The Annual Financial Statement of the Institute for the financial year 2015-16 duly audited by the Principal Accountant General (Audit), Kerala is annexed to this report. The Separate Audit Report and the Institute's replies to the points raised in the report are also annexed. The Internal Audit of the Accounts of the Institute was carried out by M/s. Mohan & Mohan Associates, Chartered Accountants.

The main highlights of the Annual Financial Statements are furnished below:-

GRANT-IN-AID UNDER PLAN

During the Financial Year 2015-16, the Institute did not receive any amount as Grants-in-aid under Plan from the Department of Secondary and Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India.

INTERNAL REVENUE GENERATION

The Internal Revenue Generation has increased from 64.83 crores to 73.02 crores. However, cash operating expense have gone up from Rs.49.11 crore to Rs.52.46 crores.

CORPUS FUND

During the Financial Year 2015-16, the Institute had transferred Rs 19.84 crores (approx) to the Corpus Fund created under the Block Grant Scheme of the Department of Secondary and Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. The Interest earned during the Year on the investment made is Rs 12.68 crores. The balance of the Corpus Fund as on 31.03.2016 is Rs 214.53 crores.

DEPRECIATION FUND

The Institute had a balance of Rs 111.17 crores in Depreciation Fund on 01.04.2015. The interest earned during the year on the investments made is Rs 10.12 crores. The closing balance of the Depreciation Fund as on 31.03.2016 is Rs 69.13 crores.

Accounts of IIM Kozhikode Employees Contributory Provident Fund Trust:-

During the Year 2015-16, the Income & Expenditure account shows a deficit of Rs 3.50 lakhs after allowing interest to the members of the Trust.

The Corpus Fund stood as Rs 428.93 lakhs out of which Rs 417.28 lakhs has been invested in various interest bearing securities as per CPF Investment guidelines. Rs 13.25 lakhs is under accrued interest and Rs 2679 is being bank balance as on 31.03.2016

As this amount is refundable to the firm due to non- participation in the programme, the non-inclusion has resulted in understatement of current liability amounting to Rs.40 lakh with corresponding overstatement of income.
- 2) A Credit Balance of Rs.34.78 lakh of the suspense account in the nature of unidentified credit was accounted under Current Liabilities-Schedule 3 A (e)(x). This needs to be reconciled and accounted for in the respective head of account. Though this discrepancy was included in the last Separate Audit Report no action was seen initiated from the part of Institute.
- **B. Grant-in-aid.** The Institute received no grant-in-aid from the Government of India during 2015-16. However, there was a minus opening balance of Rs. 24.72 crore as on 1st April 2015.

General Comments

The Institute has not made actuarial valuation of liability for gratuity as on 31.3.2016 nor the fact disclosed in the Notes on Accounts (Schedule 24).
- 4. As per Standards on Auditing (SA) 505, third party confirmation of debt has to be verified in audit. Audit during the verification found that third party confirmation was obtained only in the case of Bank Deposit and Bank Accounts. No confirmation from debtors/receivables is available for the outstanding amount shown in the Annual Accounts.

As this amount is refundable to the firm due to non-participation in the programme, the non-inclusion has resulted in understatement of current liability amounting to Rs.40 lakh with corresponding overstatement of income.	It is submitted that the candidate was unable to attend the programme due to unavoidable health reasons, which she had intimated in the last minute. Moreover, at the time of finalization of accounts she has not requested for refund of fees paid. But later, she has requested that she may be permitted to attend the next programme. However a programme of the same nature has not yet been conducted at the Institute, nor has the Institute agreed to consider her request. The process of seeking a decision as to whether she would be allowed to participate in another programme has not being taken up by the Institute. Even on this date, whether it is to be considered as income or whether it would be refunded-(to be considered as liability) is not clear. If the request is considered, then it would be considered appropriately in the next year's accounts. Hence it is requested that the comment may be dropped.
2) A Credit Balance of Rs.34.78 lakh of the suspense account in the nature of unidentified credit was accounted under Current Liabilities- Schedule 3 A (e)(x). This needs to be reconciled and accounted for in the respective head of account. Though this discrepancy was included in the last Separate Audit Report no action was seen initiated from the part of Institute.	A credit balance of Rs 34.78 Lakhs in Suspense Account relates to online remittance to our bank account. The matter has been taken up with the SBI branch at IIM Kozhikode several times. It is understood that details of online remittances are available only in the Head office of SBI at Mumbai. During the current year details of three remittances have been received but it seems that the transaction do not relate to our Institute. If the amounts are not reversed by the bank, then the same shall be credited to miscellaneous income after the stipulated period. Considering the above, it is requested to drop the above query.

These corrections have been made which will be reflected in the printing of accounts.

Gratuity Fund is maintained by LIC. The payments are released based on actuarial valuation certification submitted by LIC. Earned Leave Encashment expenditure is borne by the Institute when an employee demits office. Hence provision is based on latest salary drawn.

Letters were issued to the debtors for confirmation of balance. Further, correspondences with parties who have replied to our letters are still in progress.

SCHDULE 23 – SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

1. BASIS FOR PREPARATION OF ACCOUNTS

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated, following going concern concept and on accrual method of accounting .Accrual method of accounting has been followed as far as possible and the deviations are as stated therein.

2. REVENUE RECOGNITION AND CHANGE IN THE ACCOUNTING POLICY

- 2.1 From the year 2005-06 the Institute is covered under the 'Block Grant Scheme' of the Govt. of India. Under 'Block Grant Scheme' Non plan grant is released on the basis of pre-fixed amount on revenue account. Accordingly from the year 2005-06 the institute has been recognizing Non plan Grant as income.
- 2.2 Interest on Investment and Mobilization Advances is recognized on accrual basis whereas interest on Saving Bank Account is taken on actual receipt basis as and when credited by banks.
- 2.3 Consultancy income is recognized on completion of the consultancy projects.
- 2.4 ePGP income has been considered for the total fee shared during the year which comes to Rs.694.57 Lakhs. Fee based on accrual method of accounting comes to Rs.774.58 Lakhs.
- 2.5 Fees from students, Sale of admission forms, Royalty & Interest on saving bank accounts are accounted on cash basis.

3. EXPENSES

3.1 Expenses are accounted on the basis of accrual method of accounting except the following.

We have prior period expenses of Rs. 37.12 Lakhs in 2015-16 which was not recognized in 2014-15.

4. INVESTMENTS

- 4.1 All investments made by CPF trust are long term investments.
- 4,2 Long term investments (Corpus/Capital Fund) are carried at their cost or face value which ever is lower.

5. FIXED ASSETS

- 5.1 Fixed Assets of the Institute are acquired out of grants from the Government of India and the Government of Kerala. Funds utilized for acquisition of assets are shown under Capital Fund (Fixed Assets) in the corresponding schedule 4 to the Balance sheet.
- 5.2 Fixed Assets acquired out of Earmarked/Sponsored Projects are booked as expenditure in concerned project account. These assets are included in Fixed Assets by corresponding credit to Capital Fund (Fixed Asset Project) in Schedule 4 to the balance sheet.
- 5.3 Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition of assets.
- 5.4 In respect of projects under construction, all direct expenses connected with the construction are capitalized under different sub-heads and apportionment of this expenditure to the specific assets are done on completion of the project on pro-rata basis. Fixed Assets received by way of non-monetary grants (other than towards the Corpus Fund) are capitalized at values stated on receipt and corresponding credit to Capital Fund.
- 5.5 Fixed Assets constructed and put to use during the year has been capitalized. Adjustments in the valuation of "Water Harvesting Pond" and interior furnishing and fit out works in MDP complex has been made as per the revised certified value.
- 5.6 Work done for Audio Visual project by M/s. Siemens in Phase IV MDP complex and "ISRO Pavilion" has been capitalized during the year.
- 5.7 The balance due to M/s GFE amount to Rs.40/-lacs (approximate) has been set aside against their liabilities on account of their non performance of the contracts besides other recoveries (including outstanding payments, if any, to local agencies engaged by M/s GFE). How ever a separate accounting entry has not been recorded in our Books.
- 5.8 The amount received from insurance company during the previous years Rs. 8,07,868/- has been adjusted as the final bill relating to revamping of the fire affected room at MDP complex has been received.
- 5.9 Necessary adjustments has been made in Fixed asset schedule and depreciation statements based upon the expenditure statement provided by CPWD in case where assets have been put to use.

6. DEPRECIATION

6.1 During the year depreciation method were changed from WDV method as per Income Tax Act to method prescribed by MHRD. Fixed assets are valued at cost less accumulated depreciation. The effect of change in method of depreciation amounting to Rs 49.97 crores (Including Project assets) is shown in Capital Fund (Fixed Assets). - 6.2 Depreciation is provided for the whole year on additions during the year.
- 6.3 Where an asset is fully depreciated, it will be carried at a residual value of Rs.1 in the Balance Sheet and will not be further depreciated. Thereafter, depreciation is calculated on the additions of each year separately at the rate of depreciation applicable for that asset head.
- 6.4 Small Value Assets are included in their respective heads based on the nature of the asset.
- 6.5 Though depreciation is taken to Income & Expenditure account to ascertain the total Recurring Expenditure, corresponding amount is reduced from the Capital Fund (Fixed Assets) and Capital Fund (Fixed Assets-Projects) so that the surplus of Income over expenditure is excluding the provision for depreciation.

7 INTANGIBLE ASSETS

7.1 Electronic Journals (E-Journals) are separated from Library Books in view of the limited benefit that could be derived from the on-line access provided. E-journals are not in a tangible form, but temporarily capitalized and in view of the magnitude of expenditure and the benefit derived in terms of perpetual knowledge acquired by the Academic and Research Staff; Depreciation is provided in respect of E-Journals at a higher rate of 40% as against depreciation of 10% provided in respect of Library Books.

8 GOVERNMENT GRANTS / SUBSIDIES

- 8.1 The Institute is financed by the Government of India and Government of Kerala for setting up the infrastructure of the Institute. The Government of Kerala provided the land free of cost to the Institute during the initial years.
- 8.1 The Plan Grants received is accounted as Capital Fund (Grant-in-aid) from where the share of Capital expenditure is transferred to Capital Fund (Fixed Assets) and the balance, if any, carried forward for the utilization/adjustment during the next year.
- 8.2 Government grants utilized towards capital cost of setting up this Institute is treated as capital Fund (Fixed Assets). Grants in respect of specific fixed assets acquired are shown as a Deduction from the cost of related assets.
- 8.3 Govt. grant is accounted on accrual basis subject to the condition that the sanction orders for grant is received on or before balance sheet date.

9 CORPUS FUND

- 9.1 Institute is covered under the block grant scheme of Govt. of India from the year 2005-06 onwards and accordingly the entire Surplus/Deficit in the income & expenditure account is transferred to Corpus Fund.
- 9.2 Interest accrued on Corpus Fund Investment and Loans and Advances granted out of Corpus Fund are directly credited to the Corpus Fund Account without taking to Income & Expenditure Account. This change is done in compliance with requirement of 'Block Grant Scheme'
- 9.3 In the current year, capital expenses incurred over and above the balance in Capital Fund Grant -in aid account has been transferred to Capital Fund (Fixed Assets).

Transactions denominated in foreign currency are accounted at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of the transaction.

13. RETIREMENT BENEFITS

- 13.1 Provision for accumulated leave encashment benefit to the employees is computed on the assumption that employees are entitled to receive the benefits as at each year end.
- 13.2 In respect of employees covered under the pension Scheme the amount received from their previous employers towards discharge of their pension liability is taken to the Pension Fund account and invested suitably.
- 13.3 Provision for payment of pension has been made as per Govt. of India pension / commutation rules up to 2014-15 in respect of the service rendered in the Institute.
- 13.4 We have New Group Gratuity Cash Accumulation Scheme Master Policy No.604000243 & Group Gratuity Cash Accumulation Scheme Master No.405475 with Life Insurance Corporation towards our liability for Gratuity payments. Premium paid/due for the year has been accounted as expenditure for the year.

14 STOCKS

Expenditure on purchase of stationeries, consumables and other stores is accounted as revenue expenditure, except that the value of closing stocks held on 31st March, is set up as inventories by reducing the corresponding revenue expenditure on the basis of information obtained from departments. They are valued at cost.

15 TAXATION

The Institute is exempt from Income Tax under Section 10 (23 C) (iii ab) of the Income – Tax Act 1961, and therefore, no provision for income tax has been made in the accounts.

16 INVESTMENTS OF EARMARKED FUNDS AND INTEREST INCOME ACCRUED ON SUCH INVESTMENTS

To the extent not immediately required for expenditure, the amounts available against such funds are invested for fixed term with Banks, leaving the balance in Savings Bank Accounts. Interest received, interest accrued and due and interest accrued but not due on such investments are added to the respective funds and not treated as income of the Institution.

17 SPONSORED PROJECTS

The Institution itself also awards Fellowships and Scholarships, which are accounted as Academic expenses.
