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DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode (IIMK) is on an exciting trajectory of expansion and growth. It has been playing a pioneering role in professionalizing Indian management through its Post Graduate Programme, Doctoral level programs, Executive Training Programs and Research & Consulting Activities. Our strength lies in our innovative and learning oriented teaching practices and contemporary industry-specific curriculum which is strongly backed-up by our sturdy corporate interface. We pride ourselves with the high quality of our faculty who have built a name for themselves in top quality teaching, high impact corporate training, and extremely relevant research.

The year 2018-19 has yet again been vibrant and bustling in terms of academic and other activities and I am pleased to share with you some snapshots of our achievements during the year.

Post Graduate Programme

The Institute's flagship programme, the PGP, continued its dominant position as one of the most coveted post graduate programmes in management in the country. With a view to uplift the weaker students at par with other students, an immersion programme was planned and, as part of this, a two-day workshop on employment related communication was conducted for 40 students. During the year, as many as 92 elective courses were offered to the students from eight different academic areas. The graduating batch successfully completed 57 Social Development Projects covering areas such as empowerment of primary and higher education institutions, women and child empowerment, digitalization of government services, identification of suitable waste management systems etc.

A comprehensive review of PGP Curriculum was conducted proposing significant changes in the curriculum of the program and the overall delivery approach including suggesting some of the alternative learning approaches to provide distinctive yet relevant positioning to the program.

Doctoral Programme

The 12th batch of Doctoral Programme witnessed a substantial increase in the number of applications and the Institute offered admission to 44 candidates out of which 27 candidates registered for the programme.

Executive Post Graduate Programme

The Executive Post Graduate Programme conducted on Interactive Learning Mode witnessed 39% increase in final enrollment compared with previous year. The Executive Post Graduate Certificate Programmes also recorded an increase of 27% in the enrollment. In association with Times Professional Learning, the Institute initiated a collaboration with Stanford Centre for Professional Development to offer a Master class webinar series on "Innovation and Design Thinking". Through this master class series, participants engage with Stanford faculty in five 90-minute live lectures over the virtual platform on novel topics.

The Executive Post Graduate Programme conducted at Kochi Campus also continued to record high enrollment. It is heartening to mention here that two of the Alumni of EPGP Kochi campus have been able to secure admission to the Doctoral Programme of the Institute.

Convocation 2019

The 21st Convocation of the institute was held on April 06, 2019. The Institute, for the first time, awarded Degrees to the graduates of its Post Graduate Programme, Executive Post Graduate Programme and Fellow Programme in Management. During the Convocation, 374 students of Post Graduate Programme and 253 students of Executive Post Graduate Programme were awarded the degree of 'Master of Business Administration'. In respect of Fellow Programme in Management, 8 students received the degree of 'Doctor of Philosophy'. Shri D. Shivakumar, Group Executive President of Aditya Birla Group delivered the Convocation Address.

Management Development & Faculty Development Programmes

Executive education has always been an important constituent of the portfolio of offerings at the Institute. During the year, a total of 107 programmes were conducted impacting 2667 participants from a diverse set of organizations. Compared to previous year, this marks an increase of 34% growth in terms of revenue generated, 15% growth in number of participants impacted and 8% growth in number of programmes conducted.

Research

The faculty members and Fellow students of the Institute undertake research on a wide range of interesting and important issues which get published in reputed scholarly publications some of the key achievments are:

- The Institute's Journal 'IIMK Society & Management Review' has been included in the highly regarded Association of Business Schools' Academic Journal Guide 2018, one of the few journals published from India and the first journal from the IIMs to make it to the list.
- During the year, the faculty members published 34 journal articles which include 11 'A' category
 publications. Two FT-50 publications (one in Journal of Management Information Systems and
 the other in Journal of Applied Psychology) have been accepted for publication during the
 year.
- Fourteen Research Seminars were conducted during the year by reputed international researchers
 covering themes such as Health care, Big data, Text Mining, FDI and Country Regulations etc.
 Some of the speakers also shared their insights on publishing different types of research articles
 (empirical, conceptual, review and case-based) in reputed journals.



Conferences

During the year, the Institute organized four Conferences as per details given below:

- Conference on Society and Management: Indian Culture vis-à-vis Western Culture, co-sponsored by ICSSR was organized during December 07-08.
- Society of Operations Management (SOM) conference was held at the Institute during December 20-22. SOM is a professional society bringing professionals from academic and industry together to help develop the field of Operations Management in Asia.
- A conference jointly organized by Project Management Institute, Indian Institute of Informational Technology & Management, Kerala and IIM Kozhikode was held during February 28-March 02.
- International Conference on Global Health & Medical Tourism was held during March 07-10.

International Collaborations

The Institute's International Exchange Programme endeavors to work with partner institutions to develop mutually beneficial, scholarly and social engagements between students and faculty members across the globe. With the establishment of partnership with three new institutions, our International Academic Collaborations gained further momentum during the year. The three new partners are University of Hull, University of Salford and Kozminzki University, all located in UK. With these three partners, the total number of International Partners raised to 40. During the year, 100 students of our PGP underwent International Exchange Programme with various partner institutions abroad. Similarly, 23 students from our partner institutions got the opportunity to study at our Institute.

As part of Distinguished Visiting Scholar Programme, three eminent visiting scholars from University of Oxford, UK, University of Miami, USA and University of Groningwen, The Netherland visited the Institute and undertook research and teaching.



Accreditation & Ranking

The Institute has already got re-accredited by AMBA and the focus is now on to get Triple Crown Accreditation i.e. getting EQUIS and AACSB Accreditations. As the first step to undergo these accreditations, the Institute has already become the Institutional Member of EFMD and EFMD Global Network in June 2018 and became the educational member of AACSB in January 2019. The Data Sheet submitted for EQUIS Accreditation has already been cleared for the next level i.e. 'Briefing Visit by EFMD Expert.

In terms of ranking,

- IIMK was ranked 6th in the 'NIRF India Rankings 2018' conducted by the Ministry of Human Resources. It is a very proud achievement, given the tough competition among the IIMs, management departments of IITs and few other private management institutions for the top honours. The points scored by IIMK for various parameters indicated that the Institute is doing well in Teaching and Learning Resources, Graduation Outcome and Outreach and Inclusivity.
- As per Best B-School survey 2018 by 'Business Standard' newspaper, IIMK is placed in the Super League (top 10) comprising of IIM Ahmedabad, Calcutta and Indore alongwith FMS Delhi and XLRI Jamshedpur.
- The Week-Hansa Research Survey-2018 ranked IIMK in the 6th position among the B-Schools of India.
- The Best B-School 2018 ranking conducted by 'Business Today' magazine placed IIMK in the 4th position among all the IIMs, while it placed IIMK at 5th position among all the Government run Institutes. Overall, IIMK is placed at 8th position among best B-Schools in the country.
- In the Times B-School ranking survey 2019, IIMK has been ranked at the 1st position.

Students' Placement

The final placement programme for a total 366 students was closed in a record six days. The average and median CTC offered increased by 16.12% and 17.5% respectively. The batch received 123 pre-placement offers from summer internship companies and through various competition engagements. A unique feature of this year's placement was recruitment by McKinsey, BCG and Bain & Co.

With regard to summer internship programme, the Institute created a history by placing the largest batch of 423 students in 3.5 days. The programme witnessed a 21% increase in average stipend and 43% increase in median stipend. 27 students got the highest stipend of Rs 3 lakhs, a three-time increase from previous year.

Students' Achievements

A number of our students received awards and brought accolades for the Institute during the year. To mention a few of their achievements:

- Abhishek Srivastava, doctoral student was selected for the Emerging Economies Doctoral Student Award 2019 by POMS which is a competition among doctoral students of three regions: Africa, Asia-Pacific, and Latin America & Caribbean.
- Priyesh V P, doctoral student received the Best Doctoral Paper Award in the 6th Pan IIM Conference held at IIM Bangalore.
- Research proposal submitted by Krishnan Jeesha, another doctoral student, was adjudged as
 one of the top three proposals at the Sethuraman-NASMEI Award for doctoral students.



- The research paper submitted Remya T. J., doctoral student was chosen for the second prize in the best paper awards in Sustainability Conference held at IIM Shillong.
- The five-member team of PGP students consisting of Aravind M, Hardik Shah, Nikunj Manpuria, Prannav Shrinivasan and Shyam Dahiwal has won the India Chapter of the CFA, an annual global competition that provides students with hands-on mentoring and training in financial analysis.

Faculty strength & Enrichment

The faculty strength of the Institute continues to be on the rise with selection of 15 new candidates this year alone. With the new recruitment, the total strength of faculty is expected to reach 82.

In terms of faculty enrichment, two faculty members attended the Harvard Business School Global Colloquium on Participant Centered Learning at Boston.

Augmentation of Campus Infrastructure

The construction activities related to the priority-1 stage of Phase V campus development continued to keep pace with the Institute's academic requirements. Two hostel blocks comprising of 112 double occupancy rooms with dining block were made ready prior to commencement of academic year 2018-19. The construction of the remaining two hostel blocks, having 122 Nos. double occupancy rooms, has been substantially completed during this period. The base-building construction works for the classroom block and offices for faculty & staff located in this building have also been completed. Construction of 20 Nos. of studio-type apartment units is also nearing completion. Sustainable and eco-friendly water harvesting and management systems have been implemented in the campus besides initiating environment-friendly energy conservation measures.

IIMK LIVE

LIVE, which stands for Laboratory for Innovation, Venturing and Entrepreneurship is a business incubator and entrepreneurship development centre of IIM Kozhikode set-up in 2016 with the support of Department of Science and Technology, Government of India. The Centre started its flagship Business Incubation Program with the objective of supporting start-ups in their early stages. As part of this programme, the centre admitted 18 new start-ups this year taking the strength of resident incubate companies at LIVE to 27. An amount of Rs 2.2 crores were sanctioned to 10 start-ups from IIMK LIVE MRPL funds in association with Mangalore Refineries and Petrochemicals Ltd.

Along with IIMK Alumni Association, LIVE launched a unique initiative called 'Staying Alive' to encourage interested PGP students to take up entrepreneurship by providing fellowship support of up to Rs 50,000/- per month for one year. It mobilized 9 alumni to pledge Rupees One lakh each and PGP-15 batch donated approximately Rupees Five lakhs to support this initiative. The Centre conducted one of the biggest Start-O-Spheres, an investor-founder meet in January 2019 in which 40 start-ups and 15 investors participated. The event was attended by more than 400 visitors.

Mentoring of IIM Amritsar

The Institute continued to mentor IIM Amritsar for the fourth consecutive year. Many faculty members of the Institute were involved in handling various PGP courses of IIM Amritsar. The third batch of 95 students graduated during the Convocation ceremony held on 22nd April, 2019. Shri Neeladri Nandi, Vice President (Business Development- New Market), Reliance Industries Limited delivered the convocation address.

The Faculty Recruitment process for IIM Amritsar was also conducted during the year and 11 new faculty members were selected in different academic areas.

New Initiatives

The Institute decided to create 60 additional seats exclusively for women in its postgraduate

programme in management from the next academic year. These seats will be supernumerary and will not affect the chance of candidates in existing seats.

- The Institute decided to launch a One-year Post Graduate Programme in Business Leadership from the next academic year.
- In order to help industry executives explore research based careers at both academic institutions as well as research roles in private/public sector organizations, an Executive Doctoral Programme (Ph. D. in Practice Track) is being launched from the next academic year.
- Two course proposals have been submitted to the Ministry of External Affairs' ITEC Programme.

In this context, I would like to thank profusely the Chairman and Members of the Board of Governors of the Institute for their visionary guidance and support. I also express my sincere gratitude to the Faculty, Staff, Students and Alumni of the Institute who put in their best for the overall growth of the Institute. It is solely because of their unqualified support and cooperation that we have been able to realize all the above achievements, and many more not mentioned here. We are also highly indebted to the Ministry of Human Resource Development and Govt. of Kerala for their continued support and for the faith reposed in us.

We seek the continued co operation from all stake holders in our journey towards becoming a world class institution.

POST GRADUATE PROGRAMME IN MANAGEMENT

The two year Post Graduate Programme (PGP) in Management of the Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode (IIMK) offers a judicious blend of theory and practice, and is deliberately designed to be change oriented. The course curriculum is continually reviewed and updated to cater to the requirements of the industry and reflect changes in the environment. A unique feature of the PGP is its in-built concern for the larger society as reflected in the design of the curriculum, which aims at nurturing ethically conscious and socially responsible leaders of the future. The Programme is accredited by the Association of MBAs (AMBA).

Consistent with the Institute's goal of creating business leaders who are socially, ethically and environmentally responsible, each student is required to provide active planning and execution to help non-profit organizations. The Social Development Project is a non-credit compulsory component of the IIMK PGP. The SDP is spread over two years, making it possible for them to carry out the project-related work at their convenience.

The PGP concentrates on subjects in diverse functional areas during first year, equipping the student with basic skills and knowledge needed at the managerial level in any organization. During the second year, students can select subjects in their area of interest. Elective Courses are offered in Finance, Accounting & Control, Marketing, Information Technology & Systems, Quantitative Methods & Operations Management, Economics, Strategy, and Humanities & Liberal Arts. The programme lays great emphasis on knowledge assimilation and towards this end, it uses a wide variety of pedagogies like lectures, case studies, exercises, role-plays, simulation, video shows etc. ensuring a holistic perspective on the economic, technical, cultural and global impact of business.

The classes for Term IV of PGP 21 batch commenced on June 11, 2018. A total of 373 students registered for Term IV (including 2 DPP participants). One student of PGP 21 had opted for Differentially Paced PGP (DPP). One student was terminated from the programme owing to academic shortfall. One student had asked to repeat the course in the next academic year due to medical reasons in the middle of Term-IV.


New Batch

The Induction ceremony of the PGP 22 was held on July 02, 2018. The Orientation Programme for PGP 22 was held during June 28-30, 2018. During the orientation, different pedagogy and teaching methods were introduced to the students. A talk on "Ethical Responsibility of Students" was also conducted.

A total of 422 students finally registered for the Post Graduate Programme. Of the 422 students, the number of female students is 110. One student of Batch 21 who had opted for the Differentially Paced Post Graduate Programme (DPP) joined the programme with PGP 22. One student was asked to leave the programme due to academic reasons and six students had opted for DPP. Thus, the total strength of PGP 22 batch was 416 at the end of academic year 2018-19.

Structure of the Programme: A practical mix of different teaching methods, evolved using feedbacks from students and other programme participants, is employed at the Institute. The importance is on learning processes and learning outcomes for the augmentation of managerial abilities. The problem solving and analytical skills are honed through case studies, which are part of pedagogy in most of the courses. The Post Graduate Programme also provides direct student links with industry and enhancement of application skills through projects undertaken for industry by students.

The first year of the programme is devoted to building up basic competence in core areas and in developing a holistic and socially mindful attitude to management. Courses in the first year are compulsory for all students. The aim of the compulsory package is to provide participants with the fundamental knowledge, skills and techniques, contextual understanding, and overall perspective, necessary for general management. Considering the importance of the compulsory, foundation-building courses offered in the first year, a substantial portion of the teaching load was taken on by the permanent faculty of the Institute. The Summer Internship and the Social Development Project provide the testing grounds for this intense learning experience.

The second year, as usual, provided the opportunity to reach greater depths of skills and capability in chosen areas. Apart from the compulsory course of International Business, the Institute offered the following optional courses in the second year of the PGP:

Workshops & Training Programmes


Business Research Methods: Mandatory Business Research Methods Workshops were conducted for all PGP first year students.

Entrepreneurship, Leadership and Consultancy Workshops: Organized three mandatory workshops for PGP 21 batch during 2018-19.

NGO Summit: The SDP Fair was conducted on 23rd February 2019. The representatives from 55 Organizations/departments attended the fair. 74 Social Development Projects were selected for PGP 22 Batch and the project work is going on.

57 out of 63 Social Development Projects were successfully completed by PGP 21 Batch students during the Academic Year 2018 - 2019.

PGP Teaching Hours: The PGP 21 courses during second year comprise of a total class room hours of 2686 and PGP 22 courses during the first year comprise of total 4338 hours.



Convocation: Annual Convocation for PGP 21 students was conducted on April 06, 2019. Dr. A Vellayan, Chairman of the Board of Governors, IIMK awarded the degree of Master of Business Administration (MBA) to 374 students of PGP 21 batch (Year 2017-19) and Post Graduate Diploma in Management (PGDM) to 02 students of PGP 20 batch (Year 2016-18). Shri. D. Shivakumar, Group Executive President, Aditya Birla Group was the Chief Guest and delivered the convocation address. Prof. Debashis Chatterjee, Director of IIMK welcomed the gathering and also presented a report on the Institute and its activities. The Chief Guest presented the IIMK Gold Medal for scholastic performance to Ms. Anchal (First), Ms. Priya Agrawal (Second) and Mr. Akash Sehra (Third). The Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode Gold Medal for Best All Round Performance has been awarded to Mr. Murali Siva K.

After the final examination of the first year, the students belonging to the 22nd Batch of the Post Graduate Programme proceeded for their summer internship.

PGP Curriculum: PGP curriculum has been revised from 2019-21 batch onwards as per the recommendation of PGP Review Committee.

A. Activities fostering Industry Interaction, Career Development and Entrepreneurship Backwaters 2018, the Annual Management Fest was conducted during 26 to 28 Oct, 2018. The theme for Backwaters' 18 was Disruptive Diversity. IIM Kozhikode has always been the trailblazer when it comes to inclusion of a diverse community. This year, Backwaters aspired to take the dialogue forward from inclusion to empowering and delivering value through diversity, and how this can result in a positive disruption in communities and organisations. The key highlights are as follows

Flagship Events

Inspirations - a speaker series from leaders and inspirational figures. The speakers who graced us with their presence were:

- Mr. Pratik Pota CEO, Jubilant Food Works: How to handle disruption in the Restaurant Industry, which has become the new reality for businesses.
- Mr. Neelesh Hundekari Partner, Asia Pacific, AT Kearney: Disruption in the textile and fashion industry.

Business Conclave: Backwaters organized the first-ever Business Conclave. The theme of the conclave is "**Turbulence in the Indian Economy - Structural weakness or Disruptive Innovation**". The panel consisted of the eminent personalities:

C. Social Service Activities

Guest Lecture on Disaster Management by Armed Forces in India

Col. NKS Warrier with students discussed on different aspects of disaster management, Government's plan for disaster management; Armed Forces' role and their way of working in such cases.

Disha Educational Project: A soft skill and personality development program for children Social Service Group (SSG) began with the 2nd year of Kunnamangalam Educational Project revamped as "Disha Educational Project". In this program, they have selected 120 students from the various schools in Calicut of 6th, 7th, 8th and 9th standard. They are being provided with classes of duration 3 hours 15 minutes fortnightly for 10 sessions. The students will receive classes aimed at improving their personality and confidence with a focus on knowledge development. The main topics covered in the classes: Public speaking and Communication, Quantitative Aptitude, Team/Group dynamics, Basic Economics, Social development, Entrepreneurship.



FELLOW PROGRAMME IN MANAGEMENT


Introduction

The Fellow Programme in Management (FPM) is a full time, residential, fully financially supported doctoral programme of the Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode. This programme provides rigorous, world-class, inter-disciplinary training in all areas of business management to equip students with the ability to conduct cutting-edge research of international standard. Our graduates are crucial source for management researchers and faculty resources in top quality for academic institutions, industry, business, government and society.

FPM is designed for a normal period of four and half years. In the first two years students focus on course work including advanced research and doctoral seminar courses. This is followed by indepth research on a thesis topic including thesis examination and successful defense.

FPM at IIMK

Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode launched its FPM programme during the academic year 2007-08. Presently seven areas of specialization are being offered viz., Economics, Finance, Accounting and Control, Information Technology and Systems, Marketing Management, Organizational Behaviour and Human Resources, Quantitative Methods and Operations Management and Strategic Management. Currently there are 74 students pursuing the FPM Programme at IIM Kozhikode in seven areas.



Financial Support

The important feature of the programme is that it offers attractive financial support to candidates, in lieu of which, the Institute is very selective in offering admission to the programme. This ensures that the quality is checked at the input stage. Further, the students joining the programme are exempted from paying tuition fee.

All Indian students joining the FPM would be given a stipend of Rs. 27,000/- per month for the first and second years, Rs.29,700/ per month on successful completion of Comprehensive examination and Rs.33,000/- per month after successful presentation and defense of Thesis proposal. During the last six months of the fifth year a stipend as decided by the student's Research Advisory Committee is given. A contingency grant of Rs. 1,20,000 can be used throughout the six years of the programme for meeting the expenses on books, stationery, computers, etc. Further, financial supports for attending National (Rs.20,000/-) and International Conferences (Rs.1,75,000/-) are also provided.

FPM Admission 2018-19

IIMK offered admission for 44 candidates to the FPM twelfth Batch (Academic Year 2018-19). Out of 44 offers, twenty seven candidates had registered for the programme. In between three of them had withdrawn from the programme owing to personal reasons. The current strength of FPM 12 batch is 24.

This year, seven students have received the PhD degree of the Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode during the Convocation held on 6th April 2019.

FPM Admissions 2019 - 20

IIMK received 863 FPM applications for the Academic Year 2019-20. No. of applications has gone up by 5 % in spite of cutting the advertisement expenditure by 13% and doubling the application fee.

Achievements of fellow participants during the year 2018-19:

During the year 2018-19, IIMK had 74 fellow participants in the campus in seven academic areas. Following are some of their accomplishments in that year.

Awards

Research proposal submitted by Mr. Krishnan Jeesha, an eighth batch FPM student, has been awarded one of the top three proposals at the Sethuraman- NASMEI Award for doctoral students. The award includes funding of Rs. 75,000/-.

Remya T. J, a tenth batch FPM student, whose research paper entitled "Is Rural Household Debt Sustainable in a Financially Included State? Evidence from Three Districts of Kerala" (co-authored with Gopakumaran Nair and Rudra Sensarma) has been chosen for the second prize in the best paper awards in Sustainability Conference (SUSCON VII) held at IIM Shillong from 29th November to 1st December, 2018.

Abhishek Srivastava, a tenth batch FPM student, whose research paper entitled "Impact of Gray Market on Supply Chain Coordination" has been chosen for Second Prize in the Emerald Best Research Paper Award at the Doctoral Colloquium of XXII Annual International Conference of Society of Operations Management held at Indian Institute of Management Kozhikode, December 20-22, 2018.

Abhishek Srivastava, a tenth batch FPM student, won the Emerging Economies Doctoral Student Award 2019 by POMS which is a competition among doctoral students of three regions: Africa, Asia-Pacific, and Latin America & Caribbean. He will receive an award plaque and will be presented at the Awards Luncheon of the 30th Annual POMS Conference in Washington, DC, USA. He will



also receive a maximum of \$2,000 to cover travel, hotel, and other expenses. Registration for the conference will be complimentary.



Important Activities: A total of 100 IIMK students had gone to twenty-four partner institutes as part of International Exchange Programme and 23 international students arrived at IIMK from seven institutions abroad. It can be seen from the following graph that over the years the IIMK students going for International Exchange Programme is consistently increasing. However, we do not see that trend as far as the international students are concerned. We may have to go and seek students pro-actively. The detailed graph highlighting past five years student exchange programme at IIM Kozhikode is as follows:



The greatest strength of the Exchange program at IIMK comes from the rigour of the entire process, right from the selection of students who will be going on exchange till the time of receiving the credits of the exchange students from the partner institute. We have also streamlined the process of allowing our students to remotely take exams of our partner institutes, wherever it is necessary. This has helped us to reduce considerable stress on our partner institutes in scheduling their end term exams and in the process improve our relations with them.

We have had a successful second round of negotiations with Hull University regarding partnership fully devoted to research and faculty exchange. We are also using this framework to draft our future MoUs with other partner institutes.



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
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

PLACEMENT

IIM Kozhikode Summer Placement 2018

The Summer Placement of the 22nd batch of Postgraduate Programme was conducted during the period October 7-10, 2018. IIM Kozhikode witnessed record summer placements, the entire process being completed within 3.5 days (including the GD day). With a 21% increase in the average stipend offered, 27 new companies recruited from the campus this season. The top 50 percent of the recruited students earned an average stipend of 2.31 lakh while the other 50 percent earned an average of 1.11 lakh. Cent percent placements were achieved with 423 offers from 105 organizations. This season the institute also recorded 7 international offers, another unprecedented record.

Summer Placements 2018 saw a host of marquee recruiters in the consulting vertical like BCG, Accenture Strategy, Deloitte USI Consulting, PwC and EY. Further, students were also offered niche roles by firms like IQVIA and Avalon Consulting.

Over 18% of the recruiters offered roles in the finance domain. Top recruiters including Goldman Sachs, JP Morgan Chase, Piramal and Colgate Palmolive made offers in Investment Banking, Corporate Finance and M&A.

General Management vertical saw a 40% increase in the number of recruiters. AB InBev joined the list of top recruiters like TAS, Mahindra, Aditya Birla Group and Airtel who have continued their long standing association with the Institute.

With regular recruiters like American Express, Microsoft, Wipro, and Microland, new recruiters Google and Citrix also participated in Summer Placements 2018. Students were offered roles in Analytics, Product Management and allied fields.

Operations vertical saw a YoY increase of 80% in the number offers given to the students. Uber, Blackbuck first time recruiters on campus offered multiple roles, while regular recruiter Amazon hired the most number of students.

Sales & Marketing vertical saw a 38% increase in the number offers made this season. Recruiters like HUL, ITC, Nestle, Mondelez, PepsiCo and Pidilite offered roles in B2C sales while AstraZeneca, HP and Medtronic offered B2B sales roles.

IIM Kozhikode Final Placement 2019

In a batch of 373 students, IIM Kozhikode witnessed 100% placements for the 366 students participating in the placements process with 390 offers from 107 recruiters. 7 students chose to opt out of the process. The placements witnessed a 16% increase in the mean and 17.5% increase

in median salary from last year. The mean salary increased from 17.8 LPA in 2018 to 20.67 LPA in 2019 while the median increased from 16 LPA in 2018 to 18.80 LPA in 2019. The top 50% of the students bagged an average CTC of 23.75LPA, a 13.1% increase from the last year.

The season has also witnessed a significant surge in the number of offers and the roles in consulting and finance domain as compared to the last year. Amazon, Boston Consulting Group, Deloitte, EY, Goldman Sachs, HUL, JPMorgan Chase & Co., Optum and PwC were amongst the major recruiters.

Bain & Co, Citrix, Exide, Everest Management Consulting, HSBC Securities, IQVIA, OfBusiness and State Street were among the 21 new recruiters who participated in the process this year.

IIM Kozhikode also takes pride in hosting McKinsey & Co, Boston Consulting Group and Bain & Co. together in its Placement Process. The quality and diversity of talent at IIM Kozhikode again proved to be an attractive recruitment avenue for the consulting industry with 30% offers made by the consulting cluster. Along with McKinsey & Co, BCG and Bain & Co. were Avalon Consulting, Cognizant Business Consulting, Deloitte, Everest Management Consulting, EY, Feedback Infra and PwC together making 117 offers.

The BFSI cluster also witnessed an impressive growth in opportunities offered at IIM Kozhikode. This year 21% of the offers were made by major financial industry recruiters including American Express, Citibank, Deutsche Bank, Fidelity Investments, Goldman Sachs, HSBC Securities, JPMorgan Chase & Co, and State Street.

IIM Kozhikode maintains its legacy of offering the most sought after Sales & Marketing opportunities with around 17% offers made by this cluster. Asian Paints, Bajaj Auto, Dr. Reddy's Laboratories, GSK, Hindustan Coca Cola Beverages, HUL, ITC, Kohler, Nestle, Samsung, Shell were among the prominent recruiters.

The Information Technology and Analytics cluster accounted for 16% of the offers through marquee recruiters like Citibank, Citrix, Cipla, Fidelity, Microsoft, Mondelez, Optum, Shell and Wipro.

The holistic pedagogy at IIM Kozhikode continues to be supported by organizations with over 16% offers made for General Management and Operations roles. Capgemini, Flipkart, Mahindra, Reliance, TAS and Tata Sky were among the leading recruiters for General Management while Amazon, Asian Paints, Maersk and RPG recruited for Operations Management.



LIBRARY & INFORMATION CENTRE (LIC)

The Library and Information Center (LIC) at IIMK (http://library.iimk.ac.in) offers a seamless learning space to its stakeholders. The LIC is envisaged as IIMK's knowledge hub and it acts as the nerve center of scholarly as well as corporate information. The LIC therefore caters the role as the chief learning resource center of the Institute. The LIC aims at providing state-of-art information backup and support to its instructional processes and research, through world class resources and value-added information services in all areas of management and related disciplines.

Innovations in Library Services and Information Management

Over the years the LIC has registered significant progress and has brought worldwide recognition and laurels to IIMK. The E-Learning Platform developed by the Center for Development of Digital Libraries (CDDL) for the WHO India Office (http://www.rguhs.ac.in/E-learningModule/index.html), the Information Portal for the Coir Board (http://coirboard.nic.in), the Greenstone Support Network for South Asia (http://greenstonesupport.iimk.ac.in) are just a few to mention. IIMK's ambitious Digital Library project (http://iimk.ac.in/gsdl/cgi-bin/library), sponsored by the Ministry of HRD (Government of India), received the status of an example collection from the world renowned "Greenstone" family of the University of Waikato, New Zealand. Another important landmark has been the commissioning of the Smart-Card based Access Control System and the Smart-Gate based E-Security System. The latest in the series of services is the Library Blog "InfoTalk" (http://infotalk.iimk.ac.in) targeted towards the students, researchers and faculty of IIMK.

The LIC at IIMK is a digital delight, available 24 hours a day, and spans throughout the campus. It is a perfect blend of digital, audio, video and print media with cutting-edge technology. It is an outstanding knowledge-centre catering to the faculty, students and research scholars. It houses over 38640 books in print form, over 163 print journals, over 2,00,000 E-Books, 6119 Bound Volumes of research Journals, over 15000 corporate annual reports and more than 20100 E-Journals from India and abroad, in addition to as many as 3700 CD-ROM publications on contemporary issues.

The audio/visual unit in the LIC hosts over 280 educational videos covering a wide range of disciplines in management. The Video Digital Library streams out the educational videos throughout the entire campus. Around 77 full-text/bibliographic CD-ROM databases on scholarly information coupled with a set of national and international databases on companies, industries and the markets are available to users through a local area network (LAN). The LIC digital catalogue (OPAC) is also available via the LAN. The portal is an integrated network of information sources. Besides serving as a webbased interface to the in-house resources, the portal also provides links to strategic sources of information. IIMK is an active member in the IIMs' Library Consortium as well as the Ministry of HRD's latest e-ShodhSIndhu Consortium (http://www.inflibnet.ac.in/ess). The annual Rupee equivalent of document resourcing in the LIC is around 6.5 Crores. With a view to promote cross-border research and bilateral industrial-economic relations, the scholarly publications of the faculty and researchers of the Institute are captured and hosted in the open access Institutional Repository DSpace@ IIMK (http://dspace.iimk.ac.in).

The Library is pleased to report that the 19th Annual Meet of the IIM Libraries Consortium was hosted by IIM Kozhikode during 06-07 September 2018. Out of the 20 IIMs, 17 IIMs attended the meeting. This year the Library has been able to indigenously and successfully switch over from the Library management software LIBSYS to KOHA, a world renowned open source software. The Library also hosts the Bloomberg terminal and Thomson Reuters EIKON terminals.

Library & Information Services at Kochi Satellite Campus

A state-of-art library has been set up in the satellite campus at Kochi. The students and faculty at Kochi campus will be able to access all the electronic resources that are available at IIMK main campus. Faculty and students are also provided remote access to all the e-resources of IIMK. The library computerization at Kochi campus has been configured by using the world renowned open source software KOHA.



INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY CENTRE

The academic environment at IIMK makes extensive use of modern technology to supplement the conventional classroom based teaching. The Institute has, therefore, set up state of the art IT facilities to meet the computing needs of IIMK user fraternity. The IT facilities and services, including the hardware and software resources, have been regularly and considerably enhanced during the year.

Deployment of LAN and Wi-Fi in the newly constructed buildings as part of Phase V construction was completed during the year.

During the year, many new applications were developed internally to support automation of various functions of the Institute. Many new software were procured and made available to the faculty and students for their academic use.

The videoconferencing facilities implemented at IIMK were extensively used for placements activities and also for other academic purposes.

Services such as the PGP Portal, Faculty Portal, PGP grades preparation, students' attendance capturing and managing, online submission of applications for recruitment, student mess billing, online application for FPM, PhD (PT), PGP-BL and EPGP admissions, Faculty Activity Reporting Tool, online leave management for both faculty and staff, online applications for International Exchange Programme, online application for maintaining the details of IIMK Alumni, elective course bidding application for PGP and EPGP, academic feedback system, facility for applying online for employment at IIMK, Research Portal, MDC guest House booking system, Complaint Management system (electrical, Civil, Estate, Computer department related issues), accounts invoice generation application (for all departments in IIMK dealing with Invoices), Faculty quarterly appraisal application, eGrant application etc. were designed/developed/modified/updated and made operational inhouse. IIMK's official web site, websites for all the conferences being held at IIMK, seminars and other important events taking place at IIMK and various other academic portals have also been developed/updated and hosted in-house.

In our attempt to provide state of the art IT facilities and services to the IIMK user fraternity, the computing facilities and services were not only continuously improved but were also enhanced so as to be able to meet the increasing demands of the ever increasing user base.

The user community of IIMK has extensively used the IT facilities and services offered by the department, during the year.

CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT

As part of the ongoing campus expansion programme of IIMK, the development of the Phase V campus buildings & structures with environment-friendly and state-of-the-art facilities and ambitious GRIHA rating, is being implemented in a phased manner to adequately address the Institute's requirements in accordance with its planned academic growth.

The construction activities related to the priority 1st Stage of Phase V campus development continued to keep pace with the Institute's academic requirements. As part of the priority Phase V Campus buildings, two (out of four) Hostel Blocks comprising 112 Nos. furnished double occupancy rooms to accommodate 224 Students along with Dining Block (with Kitchen facility) having a seating





capacity of about 160 No's were made ready for occupation at the very beginning of the Academic year 2018-19. The works related to the remaining two Hostel Blocks having 122 Nos. double occupancy rooms (to accommodate 244 Students) have been targeted for completion prior to commencement of the forthcoming Academic year. Meanwhile, the base-building construction for the Phase V Classroom Block was completed and furnishing of 4 No's Gallery type classrooms besides offices for faculty & staff located in this building were also carried out during this period. In addition, out of four Housing Blocks comprising a total of 50 Nos. residential units for accommodating faculty and staff, the construction of 20 Nos. studio-type apartment units is nearing completion.

In line with the increase in the Institute's academic activities, value addition of existing infrastructural facilities, including major maintenance and miscellaneous construction activities, were also taken up on the side-lines of the major campus development activities.

Apart from providing state-of-the-art infrastructural facilities in picturesque settings, sustainable and eco-friendly water-harvesting & management systems were implemented besides initiating other environment-friendly energy conservation measures.

IIMK LIVE

IIMK LIVE is a business incubator and entrepreneurship development centre of IIM Kozhikode setup with the support of Department of Science and Technology, Government of India. Established in June 2016, the centre is envisioned to function as a business incubator with a purpose of creating a National Centre of Excellence that promotes innovation, new business venturing and entrepreneurship. Towards this, it seeks to emerge as a collaborative platform that help transform innovative ideas into business ventures that make significant economic and social impact. As an on-campus Incubator, it stands to gain immensely from the faculty members, students, research & knowledge base, alumni, institutional networks and other resources at IIM Kozhikode.

Business Incubation Program

 Selection Process for admission of new startups to business incubation program, round one 2018(R1) was conducted in April 2018. IIMK LIVE received overall 84 applications and in that 19 start-ups were shortlisted for final pitching and out of that 11 were admitted to business

- incubation program.
- Quarterly progress review of startups in Cohort (17R2) was held on July 26th to 27th at IIMK LIVE. As a part of the review, their activity and progress were discussed in detail and the action plan for next quarter was finalized.
- Admissions for final cohort of 2018, (18R2) for Business Incubation program was announced on 1st August. About 80 applications from start-ups across India were received and in that 27 start-ups were shortlisted for pitching on December 13-14, 2018 and out of that 7 startups were admitted to business incubation programme.
- Quarterly reviews of 17R2 and 18R1 cohort were conducted on 25th, 26th and 27th March and feedback on the action plan for next guarter was provided to the startups.

Entrepreneurship Training and Workshops

- IIMK LIVE conducted one-day workshop for founders of start-ups and entrepreneurs of SMEs on September 22, 2018. The topic for the workshop was 'Crafting Value Proposition'.
- IIMK LIVE conducted another one-day workshop for founders of start-ups and entrepreneurs of SMEs on November 10th, 2018. The topic for the workshop was 'Market Potential and Assessment for startups.
- IIMK LIVE in association Cardiff University Business School conducted a session on "Forecasting for Social Good" on December 10, 2018.
- IIMK LIVE has conducted one day workshop on "Smart Financing and Term Sheet Negotiation" at Kochi Campus for startups across Kerala as a part of our initiative "LIVE WORKSHOP" Series.
- IIMK LIVE rolled out an entrepreneurship development programme for startups incubated at Kerala Startup Mission (KSUM) and the session will be conducted between 11th March to 15th March 2019.
- IIMK LIVE launched a new initiative called "LIVE FOUNDERS TALK" for startups incubated at LIVE. The objective of this initiative is to given an opportunity to interact with successful entrepreneurs to understand their success story. As a part of this initiative LIVE FOUNDERS TALK was conducted on 22nd Feb 2019 at LIVE office.





External Linkages and Partnerships

- IIMK LIVE concluded an agreement with Mangalore Refineries and Petrochemicals Limited for startup funding, towards this MRPL has sanctioned Rs. 2.2Crores for 11 LIVE startups as external seed funding.
- As a part of CSR-Startup Support initiative of HDFC Bank, IIMK LIVE got into an agreement with them to provide seed fund of Rs 25 Lacs to LIVE Startups.
- IIMK LIVE got into an agreement with BPCL to fund some of the LIVE startups.
- With the objective of providing better facilities and support system for startups IIMK LIVE partnered with service providers like clear tax, Brand Capital, Ynos venture engine, Live Plan etc.
- IIMK LIVE strengthened the funding agency network by roping in more angels and VC's. Currently we have 15 VC's/angel networks to support LIVE startup in fund raising.

- Along with KSUM & Techstars, IIMK LIVE hosted startup weekend on February 15 to 17 at IIMK Campus. More than 60 aspiring entrepreneurs had come to campus to attend this event.
- IIMK LIVE hosted the event Start-O-Sphere (National Entrepreneurship Submit) on 27th of Jan'19 at IIMK Campus. Nearly 40 selected startups and 11 angel/VC investors participated in this event.
- IIMK LIVE partnered with IAMAI (Internet and Mobile Association of India) and Kerala Startup Mission to host a Tech Start-up Summit on March 29, 2019 at IIMK Campus. The summit aimed at triggering technology led innovations is titled 'Solve for India'. It discussed the role of new digital technologies in solving the country's problems as entrepreneurs see them as business opportunities. More than 350 entrepreneurs/students participated in this event.

ANNUAL ACCOUNTS AND FINANCIAL POSITIONS

The Annual Financial Statements for the year 2018-19 was approved and adopted by the BOG on 22nd June 2019. The Annual Financial Statement of the Institute for the financial year 2018-19 is annexed to this report. The C & AG audit of the accounts have been conducted and the Separate Audit Report has been issued on 01.11.2019.

The main highlights of the Annual Financial Statements are furnished below:

INTERNAL REVENUE GENERATION AND REVENUE EXPENSES

The Internal Revenue Generation has increased from Rs 93.38 crores to Rs 117.31 crores. However, cash operating expense have gone up from Rs 70.22 crores to Rs 88.88 crores.

CORPUS FUND

Institute had a balance of Rs.302.31 crores as corpus fund balance as on April 1st 2018. During the Financial Year 2018-19, the Institute had transferred Rs 26.94 crores to the Corpus Fund as Net Operating surplus for the year. The Interest earned during the Year on the investment made was Rs 22.80 crores. Rs.40.84 crores of capital expenses incurred during the year has been debited to the Corpus. Balance of the Corpus Fund as on 31.03.2019 is Rs 311.34 crores.

ACCOUNTS OF IIM KOZHIKODE EMPLOYEES CONTRIBUTORY PROVIDENT FUND TRUST (CPF):

During the Year 2018-19, the Income & Expenditure account shows a surplus of Rs 0.95 lakhs after allowing interest to the members of the Trust. The balance in the members' account stood as Rs 634.83 lakhs. The balance in the reserve was Rs.8.66 lakhs. Out of which Rs 599.98 lakhs has been invested in various interest bearing securities as per CPF Investment guidelines. Rs 41.61 lakhs is under accrued interest and Rs 1.90 lakhs is being balance with IIMK as on 31.03.2019



SEPARATE AUDIT REPORT OF THE COMPTROLLER & AUDITOR GENERAL OF INDIA ON THE ACCOUNTS OF THE INDIAN INSTITUTE OF MANAGEMENT, KOZHIKODE (IIMK) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2019

- 1. We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of the Indian Institute of Management, Kozhikode (IIMK) as at 31 March 2019 and the Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account for the year ended on that date, under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller & Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 23 (3) of the Indian Institutes of Management Act, 2017. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Institute's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.
- 2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency —cum performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports /CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. Based on our audit, we report that:
 - We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
 - ii. The Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Account dealt with by this report have been drawn up in the format approved by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India under Section 23(1) of the Indian Institutes of Management Act, 2017;
 - iii. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the IIMK as required under Section 23(1) of the Indian Institutes of Management Act, 2017 in so far as it appears from our examination of such books; and

iv. We further report that:

A. Balance Sheet

A.1 Application of Funds

A.1.1 Loans, Advances and Deposits (Sch.8) - Rs 3688.82 lakh

This includes Rs 255.85 lakh (credit balance) being amount refundable to the students which should have been booked under Sch.3 Current Liabilities & Provisions in the Balance Sheet instead of setting off against Sundry Debtors Account.

This has resulted in the understatement of Loans, Advances and Deposits by Rs 255.85 lakh with corresponding understatement of Current Liabilities and Provisions (Sch.3).

B. Grants in Aid

During the year 2018-19, IIMK received 'Nil' grant from Government of India or any other Government and there was no opening balance of Grants for the year 2018-19.

C. Management Letter

The deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of Indian Institute of Management, Kozhikode through a Management Letter issued separately for remedial/corrective action.

- v. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.
- vi. Application of Funds A.1.1 Loans, Advances and Deposits (Sch.8) — Rs 3688.82 lakh This includes Rs 255.85 lakh (credit balance) being amount refundable to the students which should have been booked under Sch.3 Current Liabilities & Provisions in the Balance Sheet instead of setting off against Sundry Debtors Account. This has resulted in the understatement of Loans, Advances and Deposits by Rs 255.85 lakh with corresponding understatement of Current Liabilities and Provisions (Sch.3).	When the GST Circular No. 82/01/2019 was issued by the Ministry of Finance on 01.01.2019, all long duration programmes of ePGP were exempted from GST w.e.f. 31st January 2018. It was decided to refund/adjust from future dues the amount of GST already collected from students from 1st April 2018 onwards. Since invoices are being raised in the name of each student this amount was credited to the students' account in order to ensure automatic adjustment against future dues. However, as suggested by the audit, the matter is noted for future compliance. Considering the above facts, it is requested that the audit enquiry may be dropped.

1. BASIS FOR PREPARATION OF ACCOUNTS

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention, unless otherwise stated, following going concern concept and on accrual method of accounting. Accrual method of accounting has been followed as far as possible and the deviations are as stated therein.

2. REVENUE RECOGNITION AND CHANGE IN THE ACCOUNTING POLICY

- 2.1 Consultancy income is recognized on completion of the consultancy projects.
- 2.2 ePGP income has been considered for the gross fee collected during the year. Amount payable to the technical partner has been accounted as expenditure. During the past years, this has been accounted on net basis. In the current year ePGP income of Rs. 23.26 crore include Rs. 4.26 crores of Income being Institute's share of fee collected during 2017-18.
- 2.3 Income consists of prior period income of Rs. 61.18 lakhs which includes Rs. 22.28 lakhs of CAT income of 2016 and other provisions for allowances written back.

3. EXPENSES

3.1 Expenses are accounted on the basis of accrual method of accounting except the following. We have prior period expenses of Rs. 193.28 Lakhs in 2018-19 which was not recognized in 2017-18.

4. INVESTMENTS

- 4.1 All investments made by CPF trusts are long term investments.
- 4.2 Long term investments (Corpus/Capital Fund) are carried at their cost.

5. FIXED ASSETS

- 5.1 Fixed Assets of the Institute were originally acquired out of grants from Government of India and Government of Kerala. Fixed Assets acquired out of Earmarked/Sponsored Projects are booked as expenditure in concerned project account. Details of all Fixed Assets are shown in Schedule 4. Funds utilized for acquisition of assets are shown under Capital Fund (Fixed Assets/Project) in the corresponding schedule 1 to the Balance sheet.
- 5.2 Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental direct expenses related to acquisition of assets.
- 5.3 In respect to projects under construction, all direct expenses connected with the construction are capitalized, under different sub-heads and apportionment of this expenditure to the specific assets are done, on completion of the project, on pro-rata basis. Fixed Assets received by way of non-monetary grants (other than towards the Corpus Fund) are capitalized at values stated on receipt and corresponding credit to Capital Fund.
- 5.4 Fixed Assets constructed and put to use during the year has been capitalized as per details received.
- 5.5 Capital work-in-progress towards the work done in Phase V campus has been accounted based on the expenditure statement received from CPWD.

 Furniture used for classroom in phase V campus has been capitalized since it has been put to use. Classroom building portion has not been capitalized since the completion certificate from CPWD has not been received.
- 5.6 Necessary adjustments have been made in Fixed asset schedule and depreciation statements, based upon the expenditure statement provided by CPWD in case where assets have been put to use.
- 5.7 The balance due to M/s GFE amounting to Rs. 40/-lacs(approximate) has been set aside against their liabilities on account of their non performance of the contracts besides other recoveries (including outstanding payments, if any, to local agencies engaged by M/s GFE). However, a separate provision has not been recorded in our Books.

- 7.2 Depreciation is provided for the whole year on additions during the year.
- 7.3 Where an asset is fully depreciated, it will be carried at a residual value of Rs.1 in the Balance Sheet and will not be further depreciated. Thereafter, depreciation is calculated on the additions of each year separately at the rate of depreciation applicable for that asset head.
- 7.4 Though depreciation is taken to Income & Expenditure account to ascertain the total Recurring Expenditure, corresponding amount is reduced from the Capital Fund (Fixed Assets) and Capital Fund (Fixed Assets-Projects) so that the surplus of Income over expenditure is excluding the provision for depreciation.
- 7.5 Software purchased by the Institute was shown along with Computer and Peripherals as per MHRD guide line. However as per the suggestions of the C & AG auditors the same has been shown under Intangible Assets from previous year onwards. Necessary adjustments have been made in Fixed asset schedule and depreciation has been charged @40% instead of 20%.

8. INTANGIBLE ASSETS

- 8.1 E-Journals/Data Bases were shown as intangible assets as per the MHRD guide lines. They were charged depreciation @40%. However, as per the advise of the C & AG auditors 100% depreciation has been charged for e-Journals/Data Bases which has already been exhausted.
- 8.2 Software purchased by the Institute was shown along with computer and Peripherals as per the MHRD guide lines. However as per the suggestions of the C & AG auditors the same has been shown under Intangible Assets from previous year onwards.

9. GOVERNMENT GRANTS / SUBSIDIES

- 9.1 The Institute was originally financed by the Government of India and Government of Kerala for setting up the infrastructure of the Institute. The Institute is in possession of 112.50 acres of land, out of which 75 acres of land was transferred to IIM by Government of Kerala free of cost in the year 1996. The remaining acres of land were purchased by the Institute through acquisition and that cost is shown as land value.
- 9.2 From the year 2005-06 the Institute was covered under the 'Block Grant Scheme' of the Govt. of India. Under 'Block Grant Scheme' Non plan grant was released on the basis of pre-fixed amount on revenue account. Accordingly from the year 2005-06 the institute has been recognizing Non plan Grant as income. As no further grants were received from Government, the balance amount of total capital expenses incurred during the year was adjusted from corpus fund as was done in the previous financial years.
- 9.3 Govt. grant received for specific purposes are accounted on accrual basis.

10. CORPUS FUND

- 10.1 Institute was covered under the block grant scheme of Govt. of India from the year 2005-06 onwards and accordingly the entire Surplus/Deficit in the income & expenditure account is transferred to Corpus Fund.
- 10.2 Interest accrued on Corpus Fund Investment and Loans and Advances granted out of Corpus Fund are directly credited to the Corpus Fund Account without taking to Income & Expenditure Account. This change is done in compliance with requirement of 'Block Grant Scheme'.
- 10.3 As no further grants were received from Government, capital expenses incurred has been adjusted to corpus fund.
- 10.4 The fund consist of internal cash income generated by the institute, matching grants, Donation and contribution by the members of the society.

11. DESIGNATED/ EARMARKED FUND

11.1 Pension Fund

The Institute is in receipt of letter no- CE/II/7-46A//16-17/IIMK/66 dt. 31/05/2016 of C&AG. Institute has initiated actuarial valuation of the pension fund, as advised by PAC. However, since the valuation has not yet been completed, status quo has been maintained.

11.2 Campus Go Green Fund

This was created in 2015-16 and income and expenditure from/for agricultural products are transferred to Campus Go Green Fund.

11.3 Alumni Association Fund

This fund was created in 2015-16 as per the decision of the BOG.and there has been a net receipt of Rs. 2,04,850/- to this fund during the year.

11.4 Staff Welfare Fund

This was created as per the decision during 2012-2013

12.1 IIMK was appointed as mentor for the new IIM Amritsar during 2014-15 by the Government of India. The transactions have been accounted in separate books of accounts.

13. FOREIGN CURRENCY TRANSACTIONS

Transactions denominated in foreign currency are accounted at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of the transaction.

14. RETIREMENT BENEFITS

- a. An actuarial valuation of the leave encashment benefit was initiated during the year. The Provision for accumulated leave encashment benefit to the employees is computed on the basis of actuarial valuation done as on 31.12.2018. Previously this was provided based on an internal valuation which was on the assumption that employees are entitled to receive the benefits as at each year end.
- b. In respect of employees covered under the pension Scheme the amount received from their previous employers towards discharge of their pension liability is taken to the Pension Fund account and invested suitably.
 - Institute has created a fund for meeting the pension liability for employees covered under GPF scheme. The Institute is in receipt of letter no- CE/II/7-46A//16-17/IIMK/66 dt. 31/05/2016 of C&AG. Institute has initiated actuarial valuation of the pension fund, as advised by PAC. However, since the valuation has not yet been completed, status quo has been maintained.
- c. We have New Group Gratuity Cash Accumulation Scheme Master Policy No.604000243 & Group Gratuity Cash Accumulation Scheme Master No.405475 with Life Insurance Corporation towards our liability for Gratuity payments. Premium paid/due for the year has been accounted as expenditure for the year.

15. STOCKS

Expenditure on purchase of stationeries, consumables and other stores is accounted as revenue expenditure, except that the value of closing stocks held on 31st March, is set up as inventories by reducing the corresponding revenue expenditure on the basis of information obtained from departments. They are valued at cost following the FIFO method.

16. TAXATION

The Institute has been registered under section 12A of Income Tax Act 1961. The tax deducted at source are shown as receivable in the books of accounts.

17. INVESTMENTS OF EARMARKED FUNDS AND INTEREST INCOME ACCRUED ON SUCH INVESTMENTS

The amounts available against such funds are invested with Banks for fixed term, leaving the balance in Savings Bank Accounts. Interest on such investments are added to the respective funds and not treated as income of the Institution.

18. GST

Ministry of Finance vide Circular number 82/01/2019 dated 01.01.2019 has exempted all ePGP 2 year online programmes from GST with effect from 31.01.2018. Institute was collecting and remitting tax on such programmes in the past. Further to the notification the Institute decided to refund the GST to the students on such programmes from 01.04.2018 onwards.
